

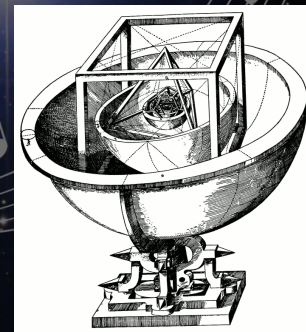
Café KITP Presents...
