Paula Apsell
Senior Executive Producer,
NOVA/Director, Science Unit, WGBH

As Director of the WGBH Science Unit and Senior Executive Producer of the PBS science series NOVA (now in its 39th season), Paula Apsell has overseen the production of hundreds of acclaimed science documentaries, including such distinguished miniseries as The Fabric of the Cosmos with Brian Greene, Origins with Neil deGrasse Tyson, and Making Stuff with David Pogue. In January 2005, Apsell introduced the critically acclaimed magazine spinoff NOVA scienceNOW. Today, NOVA is the most watched science series on American television, a top website on PBS.org, and has won every major broadcasting award, including the Emmy, the Peabody, and the dupont-Columbia Gold Baton. Paula Apsell has been recognized with numerous individual awards and has served on several boards including that of the Smithsonian's National Museum of Natural History. She was recently Journalist-in-Residence the Kavli Institute for Theoretical Physics at UC Santa Barbara.
